Partners for the Common Good has announced two key appointments.

Lucy Tuck, a seasoned community development lender, will serve as Chief Lending and Credit Officer. Tuck previously held the position of Vice President of Capital Solutions at IFF, a CDFI loan fund based in Chicago that serves the Midwest region. She has been a member of PCG's Loan Committee since 2011. Tuck will be filling a position formerly held by Kristin Faust, who became President of Neighborhood Housing Services of Chicago, Inc. in October of this year.

Dana Weinstein has been promoted to the position of Director of CapNexus, PCG's newest initiative. CapNexus is an online database that matches capital and partners to community development finance opportunities. Weinstein most recently served as PCG's Investments and Impact Manager. She began her work with PCG as Public Policy and Communications Associate.

Lucy Tuck – Biography

Chief Lending and Credit Officer Lucy Tuck oversees PCG’s lending, portfolio management, and cultivating managing PCG national Network of lending partners. She conducts credit analysis and underwriting of loan requests. Before joining PCG, Lucy was Vice President of Lending at Chicago-based CDFI loan fund IFF, where she was responsible for the day-to-day management of the lending function. Lucy expanded IFF’s lending in Wisconsin and oversaw significant growth in IFF’s Affordable Housing program and portfolio. Previously, Lucy had been Risk Infrastructure Manager of the Commercial Business Group for Citigroup, where she worked for 30 years in small business, real estate and consumer lending and risk management. She directed the national resources responsible for portfolio reporting and analytics, proprietary credit approval, administration systems and central credit processing and compliance.

As the Director of CapNexus, Dana Weinstein oversees the platform, including business and product development. Previously, she was the Investments & Impact Manager for PCG.
